CONCUSSION GUIDANCE





In line with the grassroots concussion guidance released by Sports Recreation Alliance and DCMS, we have created an updated process for reporting suspected / confirmed concussions which all schools who participate in Schools RL competitions must follow.

The process is outlined below;

- All staff involved in coaching / accompanying teams participating in Schools RL fixtures must read our School Concussion Guidance document, complete the associated learning check online and complete the waiver form confirming they understand and will apply the SRA concussion guidelines (documents provided separately).
- Any instances of suspected / confirmed concussion in Schools RL fixtures (or training) must be reported to the RFL via the <u>School and Concussion</u> <u>Reporting Form</u>.
- The parent/carer of the affected player must be informed as soon as possible and given relevant information about the details and mechanism of the injury. This should be recorded by them on a Concussion Guidance GRTP document which we recommend you share with all parents ahead of any fixtures taking place. It will then be their responsibility to ensure their child follows the recommended graduated return to play stages (GRTP) over the following 21 days (minimum) mapped out in the document. The ensuing break from playing following a concussion covers ALL sports, not just Rugby League activity. As a teacher, you must support this process by omitting them from contact activity (training or matches) until the GRTP period is complete.
- A copy of the Concussion Report Tool (CRT6) should be kept with your first aid equipment and be available pitch side at all training and matches for reference.


